### A Reflection from Catrina Charlesworth, Worship Leader

I don't suppose anyone is counting how many days it is after Christmas! Candlemas, celebrated on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, is forty days after Christmas. It also marks the presentation of Jesus at the Temple and the purification of Mary. Many churches (including Llyswen) keep their cribs up until Candlemas. It traditionally marks the end of the Christmas season and any decorations not taken down on twelfth night should now be removed.

The name Candlemas derives from the practice of blessing candles to be used in church and home throughout the coming year. These candles are believed to bring protection, warmth and blessings, and symbolise the light of Christ, who dispels darkness both literally and spiritually. Candlemas may be a little known Festival to the world at large but it is a time of quiet reflection in the liturgical calendar and reminds us of the enduring power of light in the darkness and of hope in a difficult world.
